



2026 Utility Rate Information

A new rate structure for water, sewer, and stormwater utility services was adopted by the Aberdeen City Council in November 2019 and set through Aberdeen Municipal Code. Utility rates fund maintenance, operations, and required utility improvements to provide you with safe, reliable, and efficient water, sewer and stormwater services. (Aberdeen Municipal Code 13.60, 13.64, 13.70, 13.80)
